DofE Gold Practice expedition:

During the Easter break Year 12 students from Harington School were busy practising for their Gold Duke of Edinburgh's qualifying expedition in an extremely hot Wales. The teams travelled to the Elan Valley area of the Cambrian Mountains in Mid Wales, where they successfully completed the expedition over 4 days and 3 nights. Students typically journeyed for 8 hours each day unaccompanied and self-sufficient.

The aim of the Expedition section is to inspire young people to develop initiative and a spirit of adventure and discovery by planning, training and completing an adventurous independent journey as part of a team. The remote environment and challenging weather definitely tested both teams. Standards and expectations are set extremely high at this level and the students definitely met them, showing outstanding resilience and teamwork.

Read Examiners' Reports

Don't just guess what examiners want—read their reports. They literally tell you what they are looking for.

Check Past Papers

Past papers help you get used to the question styles and wording, so nothing catches you off guard.

Be Prepared

Don't skip topics and hope for the best. Grab the syllabus and tick things off as you go.

Make It Manageable

Revision can feel overwhelming, so break it down into smaller chunks—it makes a huge difference.

Don't Rely on Cramming

Revise as you go. If you wait until the last minute, it won't stick.

Create a Plan

A revision timetable stops you from wasting time figuring out what to study. Plan ahead, and you will thank yourself later.

GEORGE'S TOP 5 STUDY TIPS:

- Stop procrastinating just do it, the more time that you spend thinking about it, the harder that it becomes.
- Don't waste time on flashy revision resources—use online tools and teacher materials to save time and avoid merely copying information.
- Use your subject specifications only learn the necessary information, making your revision more manageable and efficient.
- Active recall the best method of revision is always to read something, memorise it, and then repeat it without looking. This commits it to your long-term memory.
- Past paper questions ensure you are getting in plenty of practice because this will guarantee that you not only know the information, but that you can also apply it to questions.

Students had an amazing time at Jump Giants in Loughborough during their Friday enrichment!






Year 12 and 13 Oddballs assemblies
