





#### Welcome

We may only have been back at school for 60 days this academic year, but we have achieved an awful lot in this short space of time. We have welcomed 192 new Year 12 students to the school, hosted our first-ever Autumn Ball (which was attended by 200 students), ran a Battlefields trip to Belgium, made donations to the Rutland Foodbank and the Young Minds charity, and competed in the Greenpower International Finals for the fourth year in a row.

On a personal note, I was lucky enough to take part in the 44th Robin Hood Half Marathon on Sunday 28 September 2025 and managed a personal best time of 1:25:18 hours. This was almost three minutes faster than the time I recorded in 2024. I have been a runner for most of my life, but over the last two years my love affair with running has grown — so much so that running is no longer a nicety; it is a necessity. It is a core part of my identity.

According to the eminent American author Daniel H. Pink, the reason I find running so addictive is that it gives me three key things:

Mastery – I believe I can get better, whether that be next week, next month, or next year.

**Autonomy** – I get to choose the races I enter, the training programmes I follow, the routes I take, and who I run with.

**Purpose** – I am curious to see just how fast I can go. I also want to protect my long-term health and fitness.

I believe students at Harington experience something very similar when it comes to their studies. They embrace the challenges that A levels provide (mastery), they make effective use of private study time and the extensive extra-curricular opportunities (autonomy), and they set themselves ambitious goals (purpose). For me, the MAP acronym explains why our students are so successful.

In this issue of the Harington Link, you can read about their engagement with the DofE Gold Award, inter-house competitions, student leadership, and sports. When it comes to building character and making a positive difference, these are the things that really matter.

Students had a busy few months organising and participating in their Duke of Edinburgh's Award expedition. The Cambrian Mountains in Wales provided a superb venue for the Gold qualifying expedition, allowing students to feel the real remoteness and unfamiliar environment of the wild countryside. On arrival at Base Camp in Llanidloes they settled in and prepared their equipment before embarking on their fourday and three-night expedition. At this level, expectations are very high and all the students coped extremely well, sharing unforgettable experiences in the outdoor environment, developing initiative, teamwork, leadership, problem solving and organisational skills. Over the duration of the expedition teams showed outstanding resilience, typically covering distances of 50 - 60 miles and finishing on the coast of Borth.

Well done to all of our students that took part. During their DofE journey over the last 12 months, students have shown so many of their hidden talents and have gained so many practical skills and new experiences. Building self-esteem and friendships were considered by our students to be some of the main benefits of participating in our DofE programme. It has also given them a spirit of adventure and the desire to seek out and engage with new and different activities.




# Rubik's cube competition

# A level results day

Students at Harington School celebrated another year of outstanding A level results, with over 30% of all grades awarded at A\*/A and well over 80% at A\*-C. This is in line with the strong outcomes achieved in 2024, but with an improvement in the number of students achieving the very top grades. Five students achieved A\*A\*A\* and a further thirty-one students achieved the equivalent of AAA or better. Students secured places at the most competitive universities in the country, including Oxford and Cambridge, and six students went on to study medicine or veterinary science.

The most popular universities amongst Harington students include: University of Nottingham, The University of Sheffield, University of York, University of Liverpool, The University of Manchester, University of Exeter, Loughborough University, University of Birmingham, Durham University and Lancaster University.

Mr Teasel said, "I am so proud of all our students and their achievements. Over the last two years everyone has worked incredibly hard and it is no surprise that the results are so strong. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the staff at Harington for going the extra mile and our parents for their constant support. Students are leaving Harington to pursue a diverse range of courses at some of the top universities and employers in the country. I am just delighted that Harington School has played a part in their journey"
